NSPCC

As you are aware we were visited by the NSPCC this week to spread the message of *#Speak out. Stay Safe* to all our children. Thank you to the parents who attended the workshop, I hope you found the information valuable. We are continuing to build on the messages learnt this week, during Anti-Bullying Week next week which will end with a whole school sponsored event on Friday 17th November. The aim of the event is to encourage children to learn playground games from the past – 'Playground Past Times'. During the week the staff will be teaching the children different games, with the older children leading a range of activities on Friday such as 1,2,3 Kick Stone, Stick in the mud, Queenie, Sevensies, skipping games, marbles and cat's cradle. If you know any games from your childhood, please share them with your children; we'd love to hear them.

Attached with this letter is a hard copy of the sponsor form and collect a small amount of sponsor money if possible. However, the aim of the event isn't about raising as much money as possible; it is about sharing the message *#Speak out. Stay Safe*, raising the profile of the work of charities such as the NSPCC and encouraging social responsibility within our school. All the children will take part in the event, so please return your forms with a signature from a parent, even if you haven't raised any money. There is special prize for the class who return the most signed forms.

Cheshire East Hospice Elf Run

As part of our PE curriculum we will be training to run the Elf Run on Friday 22nd December – we aim to run up to 10k on the Parish Field, wearing our elf hats, to raise money for the Cheshire East Hospice. Parents are welcome to join us for the run too! In return for a minimum donation of £2, Cheshire East Hospice will deliver a whole school assembly and supply each child with an elf hat. We will be sending sponsor forms out during December. Again, the main aim of the campaign is to increase fitness levels, have fun and raise awareness of an important local charity who do fantastic work, particularly around Christmas.

Children's Takeover Day

This year is the tenth anniversary of the Takeover Challenge, originally launched in 2007 by the Children's Commissioner's Office as a fun, imaginative and exciting activity to encourage organisations across England to open their doors to children and young people to take over adult roles.

The Takeover Challenge puts young people into decision-making positions and encourages organisations and businesses to hear their views. Children gain a valuable insight into the adult world and gain experience of a workplace, while organisations benefit from a fresh perspective on their work.

Over the last 10 years, the Takeover Challenge has taken on a life of its own and grown into a real success story. It's no longer seen just as an event organised and promoted only by the Children's Commissioner. In last two years alone, nearly 100,000 children have taken part – stepping into the shoes of a wide range of adult jobs including everything from MPs, mayors, TV presenters and teachers, to chief executives, business leaders and government officials.

This year we are holding our Takeover Day on Wednesday 22nd November. Our Head Girl and Head Boy have been busy planning the event and have decided on the following ideas:

- Write to parents to find out if their child can attend their place of work for the day.
- Write to local businesses in Peover and Chelford to find out if children from Peover can attend on work experience for the day.
- Plan a programme of activities for leading and teaching in school. This will range from leading assemblies, cooking in the kitchen, carrying out midday supervision, teaching lessons and monitoring activities.
