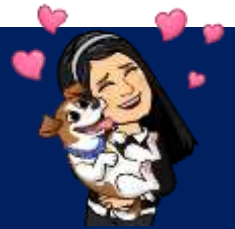

All this, as well as, the puppy yoga on Thursday which really was a beautiful experience for our class 2 and 3 children to really support their mental health and well-being - as you can imagine the feedback from our children was fantastic and now they all want a school puppy! Thank you to Sadie for offering to do the photography - we have lots of photos to share and to display in school! Every breaktime, during lining up, children have been picking a box from our Well-Being calendar and have been challenged to do some Random Acts of Kindness throughout the day. This has been lovely to watch and listen to as I have worked in classes and walked around school - it really does help with our mental health.

We also focused our attention on Safer Internet Day on Tuesday with a whole school assembly from Mrs Blackham. Children were encouraged to talk about ways to stay safe online and looked at the risks and rules for staying safe. In lessons children continued this work by looking at digital footprints and finding out why it is important to talk about safer internet use when using their electronic devices.

More wonderful news this week was that our new canopy has arrived for the field area. This will enable our gardening club members, as well as other children using Jubilee Wood, to sit under the canopy whilst learning or taking part in some forest schools type activities. Request for Absence

The Principal will not grant **any** leave of absence during term time unless there are exceptional circumstances. It is important for parents to understand that they have no entitlement to take their child out of school for a holiday in term time. Peover Superior uses a specific request form for any absences. We believe this complies with current regulations. This form can be found on the website.

The LA will issue Fixed Penalty Notices related to irregular unauthorised absences and unauthorised. Failure to make payment will result in the LA taking legal action for failure to ensure regular attendance at school under Section 444 (1) Education Act 1996.

Friendly Reminders

- As the weather is still cold and wet please could children ensure they have a waterproof coat, old trainers/wellies so that they are prepared for all weathers and can continue to be outdoors.
- Please can children have their water bottles with them daily and a healthy option break-time snack - **this should be an appropriate portion so that our children eat and enjoy their lunchtime meal.**
- The back gate will be open each morning and after school for the school taxi and for disabled access use only. This is to ensure safety of all children.
- Just a friendly reminder that dogs are not allowed on our school premises - thank you for your support with this.

Safe Parking & Dogs

Just a polite reminder when dropping off children in the morning to park safely. Please do not park on the zig zag lines and where possible try to use the lay-by areas, and not park directly outside of the school. This will ensure the safety of everyone crossing at this busy time.

Also, we have been asked to remind families that dogs are not permitted in the park opposite the school.

Sustainability - Top Tip of The Week



Go #PlasticFree

Plastic never goes away. Today billions of pounds of it can be found in swirling convergences making up about 40 percent of the world's ocean surfaces. Every year thousands of seabirds, sea turtles, seals and other marine mammals are killed after ingesting plastic or getting tangled up in it. You can start cutting down on your plastic waste in a few simple steps: use reusable bags when you shop, ditch single-use water bottles, bags, and straws and avoid products made from or packaged in plastic whenever possible (e.g., select unwrapped produce at the grocery store, shop local, cut down on online shopping).



Reading to your child

It might seem like everything has gone digital, but books still play a very important part in school life. As well as giving your child a head start, developing a love of reading can be really enjoyable.



Make books and stories part of everyday life:

- Build a reading story into a routine, e.g. a story at bedtime.
- Stick your feet up and let your child see you reading a book.
- Go to the library so your child can choose some books to borrow for free.
- Read in fun places, e.g. a den made from blankets.
- Give books as birthday presents - this will show you value them.
- Keep books in your bag or the car.

Safeguarding Tip of the Week

Top tips for keeping your children safe in the car and when you're out and about

UK law requires that all children travelling in cars use the correct child restraints until they reach 12 years old or 135cm in height, whichever comes first. In the UK, it is illegal to drive or travel in a car without a properly fastened seat belt. As the driver of a car, you are **legally responsible** for making sure that any passenger under 14 years old is using an appropriate child restraint or an adult seatbelt. Activate the child safety locks on your car doors to prevent children from opening the doors while the car is moving or standing still. Never leave children unattended in a car even for a minute. Even if you're only planning on being out of the car for a few minutes a variety of dangers or hazards might arise.

Online Safety Tip of the Week

Welcome to our 'Online Safety Tip of The Week'. On each newsletter, we will provide you with some useful hints, tips, guides and fact sheets from the [National Online Safety \(NOS\)](#) website that you as parents and carers will be able to use to help keep your child safe whilst online.



This week's free online safety guide focuses on '[Roblox](#)'. Roblox is an online game creator system where the majority of the content is created by "amateur" game creators in Roblox studio. These game makers are able to create and publish games to the community using simple tools, which can then be played by children worldwide, often online together, through a phone or tablet application or a web browser. Due to this, PEGI has altered their rating from PEGI 7 to 'Parental Guidance Recommended' because of the amount of user-generated content.
