## Message from Mrs Munro

It has been a very busy week here at Peover with lots of exciting learning happening around school! Children have been working incredibly hard in their lessons and there have been some amazing science and history lessons taking place. Class 2 conducted an experiment with carnation flowers as they have been learning all about the different parts of plants and their functions. This experiment, using food colouring in water, showed how the stem transports the water to the flower. The children had an amazing time in this lesson and were able to confidently talk about their learning. In Class 1, children were finding out about Sir Bernard Lovell and his link to Jodrell Bank as part of their history lesson, Class 3 continued to work on their liquids, solids and gases in science and once again were fantastic in their discussions of their learning. Reception continued working on their family history and looked at photos and talked about their families in their history lesson.

Thank you this week goes to the Reception and Class 1 team of staff for organising the trip to Lower Moss Wood. This trip enabled the children to explore their local area and look for signs of Spring. They took part in walks, sang songs and even managed to do a spot of pond dipping!

Miss Oakley took some of our class 2 and class 3 girls to a football tournament on Wednesday after school at Holmes Chapel Comp. The girls worked incredibly hard, demonstrating resilience and teamwork while having fun. Well Done everyone!

Our gardening club had another great week, the sun was shining and they were able to go out onto the field and into Jubilee forest.

Thank you goes to our Gardening Volunteers as well this week who were able to offer some of their time in school to work on the school grounds. They worked alongside our children to plant, create bug houses and willow structures. These will all be enjoyed in the future by our children and families.

## Request for Absence

The Principal will not grant **any** leave of absence during term time unless there are exceptional circumstances. It is important for parents to understand that they have no entitlement to take their child out of school for a holiday in term time. Peover Superior uses a specific request form for any absences. We believe this complies with current regulations. This form can be found on the website.

**We are receiving a large volume of holiday requests during term time, please be aware that these are unauthorised and the LA will issue Fixed Penalty Notices related to irregular unauthorised absences.**

Failure to make payment will result in the LA taking legal action for failure to ensure regular attendance at school under Section 444 (1) Education Act 1996.

## Friendly Reminders

- As the weather is still cold and wet please could children ensure they have a waterproof coat, old trainers/wellies so that they are prepared for all weathers and can continue to be outdoors.
- Please can children have their water bottles with them daily and a healthy option break-time snack - **this should be an appropriate portion so that our children eat and enjoy their lunchtime meal.**
- Just a friendly reminder that the back gate will be open each morning and after school for the school taxi and for disabled access use only. This is to ensure safety of all children.
- Just a friendly reminder that dogs are not allowed on our school premises - thank you for your support with this.

## Safe Parking & Dogs

Just a polite reminder when dropping off children in the morning to park safely. Please do not park on the zig zag lines and where possible try to use the lay-by areas, and not park directly outside of the school. This will ensure the safety of everyone crossing at this busy time.

Also, we have been asked to remind families that dogs are not permitted in the park opposite the school.

## Sustainability Top Tip

### *Drive Less, Drive Green*

Changing your driving habits can dramatically reduce your carbon footprint. Walk, bike, carpool or use public transportation whenever possible. Combine errands to make fewer trips. Participate in, or start, car-free days in your community. It's also important to keep your car in shape with regular tune-ups and tyre inflations. Tune-ups can increase your fuel efficiency by up to 40%, saving you money and helping to save the environment.



## Reading to your child

It might seem like everything has gone digital, but books still play a very important part in school life. As well as giving your child a head start, developing a love of reading can be really enjoyable.



Make books and stories part of everyday life:

- Build a reading story into a routine, e.g. a story at bedtime.
- Stick your feet up and let your child see you reading a book.
- Go to the library so your child can choose some books to borrow for free.
- Read in fun places, e.g. a den made from blankets.
- Give books as birthday presents - this will show you value them.
- Keep books in your bag or the car.

## Safeguarding Tip of the Week *self-harm*

This week's focus is self-harm. For many young people, self-harm can be a way of releasing tension and or coping with difficult feelings. The physical pain of hurting themselves can be a distraction from the emotional pain they are struggling with. Some difficult experiences or emotions can make self-harm more likely in children: for example, having low self-esteem or feeling like they're not good enough, or grieving or having problems with family relationships. Signs that children are self-harming can include; covering up, unexplained bruises, becoming withdrawn and spending a lot of time alone in their room. Supporting a child with that self-harm includes helping a child to manage their emotions and look at the root of the self-harming.

While Minecraft is considered relatively safe, there are some safety precautions parents may want to consider before allowing children to play the game.
