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## Request for Absence

The Principal will not grant **any** leave of absence during term time unless there are exceptional circumstances. It is important for parents to understand that they have no entitlement to take their child out of school for a holiday in term time. Peover Superior uses a specific request form for any absences. We believe this complies with current regulations. This form can be found on the website.

**We are receiving a large volume of holiday requests during term time, please be aware that these are unauthorised and the LA will issue Fixed Penalty Notices related to irregular unauthorised absences.**

Failure to make payment will result in the LA taking legal action for failure to ensure regular attendance at school under Section 444 (1) Education Act 1996.

## Friendly Reminders

- As the weather is still cold and wet please could children ensure they have a waterproof coat, old trainers/wellies so that they are prepared for all weathers and can continue to be outdoors.
- Please can children have their water bottles with them daily and a healthy option break-time snack - **this should be an appropriate portion so that our children eat and enjoy their lunchtime meal.**
- Just a friendly reminder that the back gate will be open each morning and after school for the school taxi and for disabled access use only. This is to ensure safety of all children.
- **Just a friendly reminder that dogs are not allowed on our school premises - thank you for your support with this.**

## Parking

During the restricted times shown on the signs, you are **not allowed to stop on zig zags or yellow lines** even just for a minute to drop a child off.

Always check the time restrictions on the signs.

Zig zag markings and other parking restrictions are there to protect children. If you ignore the restrictions, you risk hurting children.

## Advice to those bringing dogs to school at drop off and pick up times

Dogs are an important part of family life for many in the school community, and as such are often included in day-to-day activities such as walking children to and from school. However, others may find the presence of dogs stressful, even frightening. Consequently, **dogs are not permitted** onto the school site. Furthermore, dogs are not to be left tied up unattended to the fence. The school's priority is the safeguarding of all its children and staff.

## Sustainability Top Tip

### Grow your own!

Even if you don't have a garden, you can still grow some food for yourself. A window sill can be a tiny garden for some herbs, you can even grow them in an old cup or bowl. If you've got a small outdoor space, try growing a few vegetables in a large pot or planter. Look around for a community garden or join a local Allotments Association and grow on a bigger scale. Allotments can be a great place to meet like-minded people too. Gardening is not only good for the environment, (reducing food miles) but it is great for your mental health as well.

If you grow too much produce for your own use, why not barter with someone who has grown a different crop rather than food going to waste.



## Reading to your child

It might seem like everything has gone digital, but books still play a very important part in school life. As well as giving your child a head start, developing a love of reading can be really enjoyable.



Make books and stories part of everyday life:

- Build a reading story into a routine, e.g. a story at bedtime.
- Stick your feet up and let your child see your reading a book.
- Go to the library so your child can choose some books to borrow for free.
- Read in fun places, e.g. a den made from blankets.
- Give books as birthday presents - this will show you value them.
- Keep books in your bag or the car.

## Coronation - Friday 5<sup>th</sup> May 2023

On Friday 5<sup>th</sup> May school will be hosting a 'Street Party' style lunchtime. Children having a school dinner will be provided with a picnic lunch bag instead of a hot meal on this day.

Please book your child's choice of sandwich for their packed lunch via School Gateway.

If the weather is nice, we will be having our lunch tables outside on the playground and they will be decorated ready for the children's arrival - A big thank you to the PTA for providing all of the wonderful decorations and bubbles! We will be decorating the playground with bunting and a balloon arch and will of course take lots of photographs to share with you all!

(Should the weather not be suitable, we will take this indoors)

During the afternoon, we will be singing the coronation songs, which we have all been practising, and will have the school maypole out for some traditional dancing. We will also be planting our commemorative tree, which has been kindly donated by the Parish Council, and laying the decorated pebbles, which the children have designed, around the base.

Children are encouraged to come to school in red/white or blue clothing or costumes if they want to (Kings/Queens etc) and wear Union Jack accessories. They can also bring in flags and crowns.

At the end of the day, during school pick up, we will be holding a Coronation themed cake sale. Any kind donations for this would be gratefully received. If all cakes could be in school by lunchtime on Friday 5<sup>th</sup> May, we can then sort these ready for the event.
