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Request for Absence

The Principal will not grant **any** leave of absence during term time unless there are exceptional circumstances. It is important for parents to understand that they have no entitlement to take their child out of school for a holiday in term time. Peover Superior uses a specific request form for any absences. We believe this complies with current regulations. This form can be found on the website.

Failure to make payment will result in the LA taking legal action for failure to ensure regular attendance at school under Section 444 (1) Education Act 1996.

Friendly Reminders

- **Please remember that the back gate is open each morning and after school for the school taxi and for disabled access use only. This is to ensure safety of all children.**
- As the weather is still cold and wet please could children ensure they have a waterproof coat, old trainers/wellies so that they are prepared for all weathers and can continue to be outdoors.
- **Don't forget to fill your Bag 2 School donation bag if you are able. Extra bags are available if needed or you can use a bin bag. All bags will be collected at 09:00am on Friday 5th May.**

Parking

During the restricted times shown on the signs, you are **not allowed to stop on zig zags or yellow lines** even just for a minute to drop a child off.

Always check the time restrictions on the signs.

Zig zag markings and other parking restrictions are there to protect children. If you ignore the restrictions, you risk hurting children

Advice to those bringing dogs to school at drop off and pick up times

Dogs are an important part of family life for many in the school community, and as such are often included in day-to-day activities such as walking children to and from school. However, others may find the presence of dogs stressful, even frightening. Consequently, **dogs are not permitted** onto the school site. Furthermore, dogs are not to be left tied up unattended to the fence. The school's priority is the safeguarding of all its children and staff.

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Biodiversity

Tap water has chemicals added to it to make it safe for us to drink but this can make it harmful to wildlife. Try using recycled rainwater to water your plants instead by installing a water butt. Many water companies offer substantial discounts on water butts to encourage customers to reduce water consumption, but you can also find free second-hand water butts on local freecycle sites. Why not start a class rota for watering plants as well?



Reading to your child

It might seem like everything has gone digital, but books still play a very important part in school life. As well as giving your child a head start, developing a love of reading can be really enjoyable.



Make books and stories part of everyday life:

- Build a reading story into a routine, e.g. a story at bedtime.
- Stick your feet up and let your child see your reading a book.
- Go to the library so your child can choose some books to borrow for free.
- Read in fun places, e.g. a den made from blankets.
- Give books as birthday presents - this will show you value them.
- Keep books in your bag or the car.

Safeguarding Tip of the Week

Radicalisation

This week our safeguarding focus is on **radicalisation**.

Radicalisation refers to the process by which a person comes to support terrorism and extremist ideologies associated with terrorist groups.

Signs to look out for:

The signs to look out for can include; being overly secretive about online viewing, expressing a 'them' and 'us' mentality, showing an aggressive and argumentative nature that is out of character and questioning their own faith and identity.

This week's free online safety guide focuses on [Tik Tok](#). The popular video-sharing social media app allows users to create, view and download looping 15-second clips. Typically, these are videos of users lip-syncing and dancing to popular songs enhanced with filters, effects and text. Designed with young people in mind (but carrying an age rating of 13+), Tik Tok skyrocketed in popularity in 2019 and now boasts approximately a billion users worldwide. Therefore, as a school we would like to mark this very special, event and have started to put together our plans.

We will be celebrating this event on Friday 5th May and would like to have a 'themed' cake sale and raffle after school.

We are also asking children over the Easter holidays to decorate a pebble based on the coronation theme just like the examples shown. These will be placed around the commemorative tree donated by the Parish Council. As they will be outdoors, they will need to be varnished. Coronation - Friday 5th May 2023

On Friday 5th May school will be hosting a 'Street Party' style lunchtime. Children will be provided with lunch bags instead of hot meals on this day, unless they bring in their own packed lunches. Please can you order your child's choice of picnic lunch as soon as possible.

If the weather is nice, we will be having our lunch tables outside on the playground and they will be decorated ready for the children's arrival - thanks to PTA for providing all of the wonderful decorations and bubbles! We will be decorating the playground with bunting and a balloon arch, and of course take lots of photographs to share with you all!

(Should the weather not be suitable, we will take this indoors)

During the afternoon, we will be singing the coronation songs, which we have all been practising, and will have the school maypole out for some traditional dancing. We will also be planting our commemorative tree, which has been kindly donated by the Parish Council, and laying any pebbles, which the children bring into school, around the base.

Children are encouraged to come to school in red/white or blue clothing or costumes if they want to (Kings/Queens etc) and wear Union Jack accessories. They can also bring in flags and crowns.

At the end of the day, during collection, we will be holding a Coronation themed cake sale. Any kind donations for this would be gratefully received. If all cakes could be in school by lunchtime on Friday 5th May, we can then sort these ready for the event.
