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## Request for Absence

The Principal will not grant **any** leave of absence during term time unless there are exceptional circumstances. It is important for parents to understand that they have no entitlement to take their child out of school for a holiday in term time. Peover Superior uses a specific request form for any absences. We believe this complies with current regulations. This form can be found on the website.

**We are receiving a large volume of holiday requests during term time, please be aware that these are unauthorised and the LA will issue Fixed Penalty Notices related to irregular unauthorised absences.**

Failure to make payment will result in the LA taking legal action for failure to ensure regular attendance at school under Section 444 (1) Education Act 1996.

## Parking

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## Biodiversity Ideas

**BIRDS AND MAMMALS**

Similar to insects, you can encourage birds and other mammals such as hedgehogs by: creating habitats (long grass, leaf piles), buying or building houses (bird houses, bat boxes, hedgehog houses) and providing food (feeders).

Making bird feeders can be a fun activity to engage students, as well as encouraging nature. You can use empty yogurt pots or coconut shells, apples and even toilet roll tubes covered in coconut oil, or sunflower butter and rolled in seeds.

### Sustainability Top Tip

#### Nature Walks

A great way to teach kids about sustainability is by taking them on a nature walk or hike. You don't have to go far to find a beautiful place where you can take them. Your local park probably has more wildlife than you realise.

During the walk, take time to talk to them about the plants around them and the animals that live there.

Ask them questions about the environment and what they see around them.

These conversations will allow them to develop their own opinions and ideas about sustainability.



### Reading to your child

It might seem like everything has gone digital, but books still play a very important part in school life. As well as giving your child a head start, developing a love of reading can be really enjoyable.



Make books and stories part of everyday life:

- Build a reading story into a routine, e.g. a story at bedtime.
- Stick your feet up and let your child see your reading a book.
- Go to the library so your child can choose some books to borrow for free.
- Read in fun places, e.g. a den made from blankets.
- Give books as birthday presents - this will show you value them.
- Keep books in your bag or the car.
