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Request for Absence

The Principal will not grant **any** leave of absence during term time unless there are exceptional circumstances. It is important for parents to understand that they have no entitlement to take their child out of school for a holiday in term time. Peover Superior uses a specific request form for any absences. We believe this complies with current regulations. This form can be found on the website.

We are receiving a large volume of holiday requests during term time, please be aware that these are unauthorised and the LA will issue Fixed Penalty Notices related to irregular unauthorised absences. Failure to make payment will result in the LA taking legal action for failure to ensure regular attendance at school under Section 444 (1) Education Act 1996.

Friendly Reminders



- The rear car park gates at school are only to be used by those requiring disabled access and for the school taxi. This is to ensure the safety of all children.



- **Dogs are not permitted** onto the school site. Furthermore, dogs are not to be left tied up unattended to the fence. The school's priority is the safeguarding of all its children and staff.

Parking

During the restricted times shown on the signs, you are **not allowed to stop on zig zags or yellow lines** even just for a minute to drop a child off.

Always check the time restrictions on the signs.

Zig zag markings and other parking restrictions are there to protect children. If you ignore the restrictions, you risk hurting children

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Sustainability Ideas

BUGS



Restoring biodiversity is not just about birds and bees, all insects are important to creating healthy ecosystems. One of the simplest ways to encourage bugs includes letting a patch grow wild – leaving grass to grow long, random weeds to pop up, and leaves to collect.

You can also install special habitats such as insect hotels, [bee houses](#), butterfly barns and ladybird houses – a great activity for eco-clubs! If you want a free alternative, drilling holes into a log and leaving it in a sunny location works just as well for encouraging solitary bees.



BIRDS AND MAMMALS



Similar to insects, you can encourage birds and other mammals such as hedgehogs by: creating habitats (long grass, leaf piles), buying or building houses (bird houses, bat boxes, hedgehog houses) and providing food (feeders).



Making bird feeders can be a fun activity to engage students, as well as encouraging nature. You can use empty yogurt pots or coconut shells, [apples](#) and even [toilet roll tubes](#) covered in coconut oil, or sunflower butter and rolled in seeds.

Reading to your child

It might seem like everything has gone digital, but books still play a very important part in school life. As well as giving your child a head start, developing a love of reading can be really enjoyable.



Make books and stories part of everyday life:

- Build a reading story into a routine, e.g. a story at bedtime.
- Stick your feet up and let your child see you reading a book.
- Go to the library so your child can choose some books to borrow for free.
- Read in fun places, e.g. a den made from blankets.
- Give books as birthday presents - this will show you value them.
- Keep books in your bag or the car.

This week's free online safety guide focuses on [Virtual Reality](#). VR is the practice of creating computer generated images or sometimes even entire worlds for a user to experience as if they were there. Whereas traditionally we'd use a television screen to view these images and games, technology now allows us to put on a headset with much smaller screens inside and become fully immersed in these new worlds. While virtual reality is safe on the whole, it does carry an age recommendation of 13 years plus, as there are some things to look out for if you plan on giving it a try...
