Important Reminders

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Request for Absence

The Principal will not grant **any** leave of absence during term time unless there are exceptional circumstances. It is important for parents to understand that they have no entitlement to take their child out of school for a holiday in term time. Peover Superior uses a specific request form for any absences. We believe this complies with current regulations. This form can be found on the website.

We are receiving a large volume of holiday requests during term time, please be aware that these are unauthorised and the LA will issue Fixed Penalty Notices related to irregular unauthorised absences. Failure to make payment will result in the LA taking legal action for failure to ensure regular attendance at school under Section 444 (1) Education Act 1996.

Head lice

Just to make you aware that we have had a few cases of headlice in school this week. We ask that you check your child's hair. Within most schools at any one time, there will be a small number of children infected with head lice. Infection levels remain fairly constant so we need your help to combat the bugs! Head lice don't always cause an itchy scalp so many people will be unaware that they are infected. We understand girls like to wear their hair down but we do suggest that long hair is tied up to minimise head to head contact in school. Treating head lice is not a problem. Detection and effective ongoing treatment of head lice is key to reducing outbreaks.

Friendly Reminders

- As we are entering Autumn please could you ensure that children have the suitable outdoor wear for the changes in weather in order to keep them warm and dry
- Please can children have their water bottles with them daily and a healthy option break-time snack this should be an appropriate portion so that our children eat and enjoy their lunchtime meal.
- Just a friendly reminder that the back gate will be open each morning and after school for the school taxi and for disabled access use only. This is to ensure safety of all children.
- Just a friendly reminder that dogs are not allowed on our school premises - thank you for your support with this.

If at any time you would like to meet with one of our teachers to discuss anything at all, please could you book an appointment slot through Janet. Due to time constraints in the morning these appointments will be held after school.

Safeguarding: Please could we ask that all parents refrain from entering the main school building or the cabin unless they have an appointment with the Class Teacher, Mrs Munro or Janet.

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Anti-Bullying Week

Next week we are celebrating national Anti-Bullying Week. The theme this year is 'Make a Noise about Bullying'.

We are very lucky at Peover Superior ils about the importance of respect

that we rarely have incidents of bullying, as we pride ourselves on teaching our pupils about the importance of respect and kindness. Despite this, it is important for our pupils to develop an awareness of the different types of bullying that can occur and empower them to speak up and 'make a noise' if they see bullying happening. This year's Anti-Bullying Week has a particular focus on understanding the difference between 'banter', 'arguments' and 'bullying', and what 'Trusted Adults' our children can speak to if they are worried.




Over the week, the children will be learning about the different types of bullying that can occur (including cyberbullying); develop an awareness of 'trusted adults' and understand the importance of acknowledging and respecting diversity and difference. Our newly-elected Peover Positivity Coaches will be leading a workshop with each class entitled – Choose Kindness! The School Council will work with Mrs Munro and Mrs Ellis-Stansfield over the week to write a child-friendly

anti-bullying policy that all pupils can use and understand.

To launch Anti-Bullying week, we will be asking all children to come into school on **Monday 13th November wearing odd** socks. The odd socks represent that everyone is unique and special in their own way. The socks can be bright, spotty, stripy, long, short - the more unique the better! **Children must wear their school uniform or PE kit as normal**.

On Friday 17th November, our school will be supporting the charity Children in Need. Children can come to school wearing bright colours, something yellow or just own clothes. We are happy to collect £1 from the children to donate to the charity or you can donate online.

Top Tips...

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Sleep and Routine

Like everyone, children need sleep and it's really important they get it (both for them and for you). Sometimes getting them to sleep is tricky, but a predictable routine can help. It's pretty obvious that a child who is getting enough sleep is more likely to be happy and alert than a child who isn't. Getting your child into a good sleeping pattern isn't just about avoiding tantrums though, lack of sleep has been linked to future problems, such as anxiety, depression, obesity and high blood pressures.

How much sleep? As a rough guide, children need:

- 3-5 year olds: 11 14 hours of sleep
- 6-12 year olds: 10 13 hours of sleep

Top tip: Turn off screens an hour before bedtime. Audiobooks or good old-fashioned paper books are a good alternative to eBooks. Light from screens stops the production of the sleep hormone melatonin.



National Trust – Autumn Idea

Catch a Falling Leaf

This is a game for the Autumn only, on a windy day. Get the kids to look up into the sky and watch the trees, waiting for a gust of wind. When leaves fall, it's a race to catch them. The winner is the person who catches the most leaves. No cheating by picking them up from the floor!

Reading to your child

It might seem like everything has gone digital, but books still play a very important part in school life. As well as giving your child a head start, developing a love of reading can be really enjoyable.



Make books and stories part of everyday life:

- Build a reading story into a routine, e.g. a story at bedtime.
- Stick your feet up and let your child see your reading a book.
 Go to the library so your child can choose
- Go to the library so your child can choose some books to borrow for free.
- Read in fun places, e.g. a den made from blankets.
- Give books as birthday presents this will show you value them.
- Keep books in your bag or the car.
