Message from Mrs Munro

I hope this newsletter finds you well. Despite the windy weather, it has been an exciting and productive week at Peover. Here are some highlights from the past week:

New Playground Markings: A big thank you to everyone for your understanding and cooperation as we witnessed the new playground markings taking shape. Your patience in keeping the playground area clear during the work was greatly appreciated. The transformation is truly remarkable, and I'm sure the children will thoroughly enjoy the enhanced play area.

Outdoor Fun on the Field: Despite the disruption, it was heart-warming to see the children making the most of their break and lunchtimes on the field with their friends. Outdoor activities contribute significantly to their well-being, and it was a pleasure to see them enjoying themselves – especially during the golf course sessions with our wonderful sports coaches.

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Uniform Reminder

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Please can we remind everyone about our school uniform policy. All children MUST be wearing black school shoes with their full school uniform and only trainers with their PE kits. Thank you for your support. Smart school uniform should be worn at all times and PE kits MUST follow the uniform colours and can be plain or have the school branding.

Our school uniform is as follows:

- School navy blue jumper or cardigan with school logo
- Pale blue cotton shirt (long or short sleeve)
- Blue and gold striped tie
- School book bag will school logo
- Grey trousers, skirt, shorts or skorts
- Black shoes
- Light blue gingham dresses/playsuits in the summer

PE kits

- School navy blue T-shirt with school logo
- Navy blue shorts
- School gym bag with school logo
- Suitable trainers

Black shoes should be worn. Pupils are not permitted to wear boots. If a pupil needs to wear wellington boots or warm boots to travel to school in comfort, they must have their normal school shoes with them to change into.



Introduction to Oracy

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This month we are starting to develop Oracy skills amongst our children within their learning. This will be as part of all lessons and throughout all curriculum areas.

Miss Downing is leading on this in school and has put some information together for you so you are aware of what Oracy is, and the impact that this will have on our children's every day learning. We will be looking at different ways to question in order to really develop deep levels of challenge and thinking. Oracy will also build confidence and develop our children's ability to question and build on other children's ideas and suggestions using a variety of STEM sentences like the Talk Tactic below:







Important Reminders

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School Attendance, including Persistent Absences and Holidays during Term Time

Following an attendance review from Cheshire East we have been notified that when a pupil's unauthorised leave <u>reaches</u> (not exceeds) 10 sessions (5 days) <u>in any one academic year</u> it will be necessary to discuss the matter with the Local Authority (Education Welfare Service) <u>and to issue a Fixed Penalty Notice (FPN).</u>

We are revisiting our letter system to parents and will be having meetings with parents at school for children with unusual patterns of attendance to offer support.

Friendly Reminders

- Please ensure that children have the suitable outdoor wear for the changes in weather in order to keep them warm and dry
- Please can children have their water bottles with them daily and a healthy option break-time snack this should be an appropriate portion so that our children eat and enjoy their lunchtime meal.
- The back gate will be open each morning and after school for the school taxi and for disabled access use only. This is to ensure safety of all children.
- Just a friendly reminder that dogs are not allowed on our school premises - thank you for your support with this.

Drop off and Pick Up

During drop off and pick up times, our playground area is busy and we kindly ask that children do not use the Astroturf area for ball games as we have had a few incidences where children and adults have been hurt by footballs, which had been kicked very hard.

The children have been reminded of this by their classroom teachers.

If at any time you would like to meet with one of our teachers to discuss anything at all, please could you book an appointment slot through Janet. Due to time constraints in the morning these appointments will be held after school.

Setting limitations on content ratings, Siri and web Searches enables you to filter out age-inappropriate content and vastly reduce the likelihood of your children
