Important Reminders

School Attendance, Including Persistent Absences and Holidays during Term Time

Following an attendance review from Cheshire East we have been notified that when a pupil's unauthorised leave reaches (not exceeds) 10 sessions (5 days) in any one academic year it will be necessary to discuss the matter with the Local Authority (Education Welfare Service) and to issue a Fixed Penalty Notice (FPN). Further info on school website.

Timeline	Penalty Charges
Paid within 21 days	£60 per parent per child
After 21 days and before 28 days	£120 per parent per child
After 28 days	The parent will receive a summons to appear before the Magistrate's Court on the grounds of having failed to secure their child/ children's regular attendance

Drop off and Pick Up

During drop off and pick up times, our playground area is busy and we kindly ask that children **do not** use the Astroturf area for ball games as we have had a few incidences where children and adults have been hurt by footballs, which had been kicked very hard.

The children have been reminded of this by their classroom teachers.

Friendly Reminders

- Please could you ensure that children have the suitable outdoor wear for the changes in weather.
- Please can children have their water bottles with them daily and a healthy option break-time snack - *this should be an appropriate portion so that our children eat and enjoy their lunchtime meal.*
- Just a friendly reminder that the back gate will be open each morning and after school for the school taxi and for disabled access use only. This is to ensure safety of all children.
- **Dogs are not allowed on our school premises - thank you for your support with this.**

Bee Friendly School Update



Avoid cutting back old plants, especially during winter months. Many insects, including bees overwinter in hollow plant stems, emerging in spring. Wait until spring to cut back dead flower stalks, leaving them 8-24 inches high to provide homes for cavity-nesting bees.

Sustainability Tip of the Week

Recycled Or Biodegradable Bin Bags

Bin smarter! Ditch standard plastic bags that take ages to break down in UK landfills. Choose recycled bin bags, giving used plastic a new life. Biodegradable options decompose quicker, but check council rules before tossing them at the kerb. No matter what eco-bag you choose, dispose of it properly – every green step counts!

This week's free online safety guide focuses on [Twitch](#). The game focussed live streaming service allows users to publicly broadcast their gameplay and commentary online for other users to watch. It's a community-driven platform where viewers can support their favourite streamers' channels through PayPal donations, "Bits" and more. Each streamer or group creates their own community for fans to interact with each other. Twitch, which allows anybody to create a channel, has more than 15 million daily active users and includes non-gaming topics such as music, cooking and art.



Safeguarding Tip of the Week

Staying at home alone

This week, our safeguarding focus is on children being left alone at home. There is no legal age a child can be left at home alone, but it's against the law to leave a child alone if it puts them at risk. Every child matures differently, and because of this, it would be almost impossible to have a "one size fits all" law. As your child gets older, talk to them about how they feel about being left home alone. If they're worried, work out what parts of being home alone worry them. Do they feel safe in the neighbourhood? Are they afraid of the dark? Talk about anything that's bothering them and discuss a solution. Understanding why they don't feel comfortable will give you an idea of how to help – or why they might not be ready to be left alone. Don't do it if they are not comfortable. Peover Superior Endowed Primary School Uniform

Our school uniform is as follows:

- School navy blue jumper or cardigan with school logo
- Pale blue cotton shirt (long or short sleeve)
- Blue and gold striped tie
- School book bag with school logo
- Grey trousers, skirt, shorts or skorts
- Black shoes
- Light blue gingham dresses/playsuits in the summer.

PE kits

School navy blue T-shirt with school logo

- Navy blue shorts
- School gym bag with school logo
- Suitable trainers
- Suitable sports footwear, e.g. football boots, shin pads when necessary

Parents/carers are responsible for ensuring their child brings their PE kit to school when needed.

Footwear

Black shoes should be worn. Pupils are not permitted to wear boots. If a pupil needs to wear wellington boots or warm boots to travel to school in comfort, they must have their normal school shoes with them to change into.

Block heels of no more than 3cm may be worn.

Jewellery

One pair of stud earrings – no other piercings are acceptable.

Pupils are not permitted to wear any other jewellery in the academy grounds, with the exception of a watch, due to health and safety risks.

Summer Uniform

Can we remind parents that during the summer, pale blue short-sleeved cotton shirts or pale blue polo tops can be worn as part of the school uniform. We are hoping to get branded polo tops for the next academic year.

As the weather gets warmer, staff will allow children to take their ties off.
