## Message from Mrs Munro

This week has seen a real mixture of sunshine and showers, but despite this, we have been able to use our wonderful field at break and lunchtimes. Children have had the opportunity to play golf, football, rounders, space hopper races, and cricket with all of our amazing teachers and sports leaders.

We have had lots of visitors in school this week, which has been amazing. Mrs. Ellis-Stansfield organised two Spanish students to visit us while they have been over visiting their family. Every class had the opportunity to enjoy a Spanish lesson with the students, and it was wonderful to watch. All of our children have really enjoyed learning basic Spanish, as well as making a traditional Spanish dish in the KS1 baking club. Thanks to both students who have truly embraced our school values.

Additionally, we welcomed Lyla, a student from Cavendish Academy in Runcorn. Cavendish is an outstanding school for young people with special educational needs, aged 11-19 years. It is designated for students with Severe Learning Difficulties (SLD), Profound and Multiple Learning Difficulties (PMLD), and Autistic Spectrum Condition (ASC) with SLD. Lyla came to deliver a basic sign language session with our Reception and KS1 children. She has challenged herself to teach children in different schools and has delivered to well over 100 schools and businesses! Lyla went away with one of our Peover certificates for her amazing achievements.

It has also been another week of transitions with our new Reception intake for September spending Tuesday morning with us and then joining us for lunch and an afternoon session on Wednesday. They were all an absolute delight and have settled into Peover school life brilliantly. They were able to spend lots of time with our children, and it was wonderful to see them playing and making friends at break and lunchtimes. We look forward to seeing them again in September!

Finally this week, I had the opportunity to spend a morning with Oak Class listening to their Speech Festival pieces. The Aspire Educational Trust is holding a very special event to support children in developing their skills and confidence in public speaking. As part of our spoken language curriculum, children in Oak Class have been asked to write and prepare a short, persuasive speech about a subject that interests them. They have presented these to their class, to me, and during a whole school assembly as part of a celebration of oracy. Two children have been nominated to represent our school at the Speech Festival with their pieces of writing. I was absolutely blown away by the sheer confidence and passion our children presented as they each took it in turns to stand up and speak. Good Luck to those nominated when they attend the festival at Macclesfield Academy on Friday 12<sup>th</sup> July.

## PENALTY NOTICE FINES FOR SCHOOL ATTENDANCE ARE CHANGING !

With the introduction of the new National Framework for Penalty Notices, the following changes will come into force on 19 August 2024.

### Penalty Notices will be issued for

**Term time leave:** Penalty Notice fines will be issued for term time leave of 5 or more consecutive days.

**10 Sessions of Unauthorised absence in a rolling 10 week period:** A Penalty Notices may be considered when there have been 10 sessions of unauthorised absences in a 10 week period.

However, we retain the discretion to issue a Penalty Notice before the threshold is met. For

### Per Parent/Per Child

Penalty Notice fines will continue to be issued per parent per child. For example: 3 siblings absent for term time leave, would result in each parent receiving 3 separate fines.

### First Offence

The first time a Penalty Notice is issued for term time leave or irregular school attendance the fine will be charged at:

£160 per parent, per child if paid within 28 days of the issue, reducing to £80 per parent, per child if paid within 21 days.

(Unpaid penalty notices may result in a parental prosecution)

### Second Offence

Where it is deemed appropriate to issue a second penalty notice to the same parent for the same pupil within 3 years of the first penalty notice, for either term time leave or irregular attendance the second penalty notice will be charged at:

£160 if paid within 28 days. (Unpaid penalty notices may result in a parental prosecution)

### Third Offence

On the third time that an offence is committed within 3 years of the first penalty notice for either a term time leave or irregular attendance a penalty notice will not be issued. The case may proceed to Parental Prosecution under the Single Justice Procedure. If found guilty of the offence of 'Failure to send a child to school' the Magistrates can impose a fine up to £1000 or legal proceedings under Section 444 (1a) can include a fine of up to £2500.

## Online Safety Tip of the Week

Welcome to our 'Online Safety Tip of The Week'. On each newsletter, we will provide you with some useful hints, tips, guides and fact sheets from the [National Online Safety \(NOS\) website](#) that you as parents and carers will be able to use to help keep your child safe whilst online. This week's free online safety guide focuses on '[Discord](#)'. Discord is a voice, video and text chat app that's used by tens of millions of people aged 13+ to talk and hang out with their communities and friends. The majority of servers are private, invite-only spaces for groups of friends and communities to stay in touch, however, there are also larger, more open communities, generally centered around specific topics such as popular games like Minecraft and Fortnite. Users have control over whom they interact with and what their experience on Discord is.



## Safeguarding Tip of the Week

*Coercive Control*

Coercive control is a form of domestic abuse that can often be overlooked. Some examples of coercive control are: controlling and isolating behaviours, using threats and coercion, emotional abuse, or economic or financial abuse. Although it is usually mainly adults who are affected, children can also be impacted by this type of abuse. Some of the impacts may be: parents and carers describing children as quiet, stressed and depressed; behaviour changes including children emotionally and physically abusing parents and siblings; children expressing worries and fears about their parent and carer's coercive and controlling behaviours; some children engaging in self-harm and disruption to children's social and support networks. ## Uniform Reminders

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### Peover Superior Endowed Primary School Uniform

#### Our school uniform is as follows:

- School navy blue jumper or cardigan with school logo
- Pale blue cotton shirt (long or short sleeve)
- Blue and gold striped tie
- School book bag with school logo
- Grey trousers, skirt, shorts or skorts
- Black shoes
- Light blue gingham dresses/playsuits in the summer.

#### PE kits

School navy blue T-shirt with school logo

- Navy blue shorts
- School gym bag with school logo
- Suitable trainers
- Suitable sports footwear, e.g. football boots, shin pads when necessary

Parents/carers are responsible for ensuring their child brings their PE kit to school when needed.

#### Footwear

Black shoes should be worn. Pupils are not permitted to wear boots. If a pupil needs to wear wellington boots or warm boots to travel to school in comfort, they must have their normal school shoes with them to change into.

Block heels of no more than 3cm may be worn.

#### Jewellery

**One** pair of stud earrings - no other piercings are acceptable.

Pupils are not permitted to wear any other jewellery in the academy grounds, with the exception of a watch, due to health and safety risks.
