Our Mini Duke Enrichment Passport helps children to:

- ☒ **Belong and Connect** — building positive relationships, working together and developing a strong sense of belonging within our school and wider community.
- ☒ **Explore and Discover** — being curious, asking questions and learning from new experiences, both in school and beyond.
- ☒ **Challenge Themselves** — developing resilience, confidence and independence by stepping outside their comfort zone and trying something new.
- ☒ **Create and Express** — sharing ideas, celebrating creativity and developing confidence through art, performance, problem-solving and innovation.
- ☒ **Contribute and Make a Difference** — helping others, caring for the environment and playing an active role in improving our school and community.
- ☒ **Lead with Kindness** — taking responsibility, inspiring others and using their voice to create positive change.

Through completing their passport, children will take part in meaningful enrichment experiences, achieve personal goals, contribute to their community and celebrate their journey through Peover Superior Primary School. Along the way, they will discover that small actions can make a big difference and that every child has the power to belong, explore, contribute and lead.

Our aim is that every child leaves Peover with a collection of memorable experiences, valuable life skills and a sense of pride in who they are and what they can achieve.

How It Works

The **Mini Duke Enrichment Passport** is the way children record and celebrate their personal development journey at Peover Superior Primary School.

Each year group has a range of challenges linked to our enrichment programme and organised into **four key areas**:

Belong & Connect — build friendships, work with others, learn from different generations and develop a strong sense of belonging in our school and community.

Explore & Discover — be curious, ask questions, experience new things and learn more about the world around you.

Create & Express — share ideas, develop talents, solve problems, perform, create and express yourself with confidence.

Contribute & Lead — help others, care for the environment, take responsibility, show leadership and make a positive difference in school and beyond.

Many challenges are linked to our monthly enrichment themes, sustainability, community involvement and the values that help our children become responsible and active citizens.

Pupils record their achievements in their **Mini Duke Enrichment Passport**, collecting stamps, signatures or stickers as they complete each challenge.

Children aim to complete **12-15 challenges** throughout the year, both in and out of school. Challenges may be signed off by teachers, parents/carers or other adults involved in the experience.

At the end of the year, children who complete their passport will receive:

- A **Certificate of Achievement**
- A **Mini Duke Award Badge**
- Recognition during a **Celebration Assembly**

Together, we are developing children who are ready to **belong, explore, create, contribute and lead**—helping them to leave Peover with wonderful memories, valuable life skills and the confidence to make a positive difference in the world.
